

Introduction



Start with your biggest bottlenecks

Maybe it's a high-traffic <u>channel</u> like sales or support.


A recurring task like weekly check-ins. Or a workflow like onboarding that follows the same steps every time.

PaySauce, a small payroll company, used AI in Slack to help new team members ramp up faster. Instead of bugging a manager, they searched old threads and read AI-generated summaries to get answers themselves. Fewer delays. More confidence.

Find answers without digging

Your team knows where everything is... until they don't. One doc's in Google Drive. Another's in someone's inbox. The final version? Maybe it was posted in Slack. Or maybe it wasn't. That's where Slack's AI-powered search comes in.

Just ask.

Instead of scrolling or guessing file names, type a real question:

- (Where's the Q3 pricing sheet?"
- "What's the latest with the Rivera client?"
- "Do we have onboarding steps for new hires?"

AI in Slack looks across messages, files, and connected tools to find what you need, even if it was posted three months ago in a private channel you now have access to.

It works across your tools, not just Slack.

If your team uses Google Docs, Dropbox, Notion, Salesforce, Asana – whatever – you can connect them to Slack. Then Slack's search doesn't stop at Slack. It checks everywhere. Instead of asking "who uploaded that brief?" or "where was that slide?", you just ask Slack.


This is where small businesses save big time:

Search also works in canvases.

- Any blockers?



Take everyday tasks off your team's plate

Make onboarding smoother

New hires have a lot to absorb. AI in Slack can help guide them.

On day one, Slack posts a checklist in the welcome channel that includes links to docs, intros to teammates, and setup steps. As the new hire asks questions, AI in Slack flags common ones so you can improve the checklist over time.

Tools used: Slack canvas + Workflow Builder + HR system integrations (e.g., <u>BambooHR</u>)

Stay ahead on leads

When a prospect books a demo or downloads a proposal, you want to follow up fast. AI in Slack posts a real-time alert in the right sales channel, includes relevant background, and suggests a first message to send. That means your team can respond while the lead is still warm.

Tools used: Slack + <u>Salesforce integration</u> + <u>Agentforce</u>

Keep tasks from slipping

Missed deadlines hurt momentum. AI in Slack keeps an eye on tasks. If something's due and hasn't been updated, Slack sends a reminder. It also includes the last conversation about that task so the person doesn't need to hunt for context.

Build a smarter, shared knowledge base

AI helps turn that daily chatter into a searchable resource your whole team can learn from. Here's how to make it work:

Start by organizing in public


Capture expertise as it happens


Let AI in Slack fill in the gaps

Offer a simple walkthrough


You don't need a formal training program. Just show your team how it works.
